



Brynt Parmeter has a diverse background in both the public and private sectors.

He is the Director of Workforce Development, Education, and Training at NextFlex, a national advanced manufacturing industry consortium headquartered in San Jose, CA and is the Co-Founder and CEO of Call Sign Coffee Company.



Prior to these roles, Brynt served as a Science and Technology Policy Fellow for the Department of Energy's Advanced Manufacturing Office; was a Co-Founder and Head of Business Development of WorkScouts, a technology platform designed to connect transitioning service members and veterans with education and employment opportunities in advanced manufacturing; and was a Partner in BMNT, a Palo Alto, CA based consulting firm focused on aligning lean start up principals to solve national security problems.

Brynt volunteers his time in support of a variety of non-profit organizations to include as a member of the board for work2future, the Silicon Valley Workforce Investment Board; as the Head of Membership, Finance, and Operations for the 26th Infantry Regiment Association; and as the Civilian Aide to the Secretary of the Army for California (Silicon Valley).
